1 An act to require age restriction of 18 to purchase electronic cigarettes in Kentucky.
2
3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
4
5 Section 1: This bill will require anyone attempting to purchase electronic cigarettes in the Commonwealth of
6 Kentucky to present some form of ID to verify their age.
7
8 Section 2: This bill will apply to anyone involved in the purchase or selling of electronic cigarettes in the
9 Commonwealth of Kentucky.

11 Section 3: This bill will be enforced by the Food and Drug Administration.

13 Section 4: This bill will have no additional cost.
14
15 Section 5: Failure to abide by this law will result in the following penalties:
16 1st offense: The vendor will receive a warning from the Food and Drug Administration.
17 2nd offense: The vendor will be fined \$500 by the Food and Drug Administration.
18 3rd offense: The vendor will be fined \$1,000 by the Food and Drug Administration.
19 4th offense: The vendor will no longer be permitted to sell electronic cigarettes.
20
21 Section 6: All laws or parts of laws in conflict with this bill are hereby repealed.

23 Section 7: This bill will go into effect on January 2, 2015, with the signature of the governor.
