3 4	Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky
5 6	Section 1: Currently, tobacco products are being sold in pharmaceutical establishments and are encouraging an unhealthy lifestyle. We believe that pharmacies, as a place that encourages wise and healthy decisions,
7 8	should not sell products, such as tobacco, that endanger people and their community.
8 9 10	Section 2: Our revisions will include the following:
11 12 13	-no distribution, advertisement, or encouragement of tobacco products (cigarettes, e-cigarettes, cigars, chewing tobacco, etc.).
14 15 16	-pharmacies caught distributing, advertising, or encouraging the use of tobacco products will be given a fine of \$1000 and possible legal charges.
17 18 19 20	Section 3: We want to prevent the use of tobacco products by selling substitutions to help people quit their habit (such as nicorette gum, nasal sprays, patches, etc.), and recommending the use of substance abuse hot lines and websites.
21	Section 4: This law will go into effect January 1, 2016
