1 An act to allow a bystander to break into a car to save a child.

2
3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

5 Section 1: The enabling of this bill will allow bystanders to break into a car to save a child, without being
6 punished for damages to the car.

7
8 Section 2: When an individual witnesses a minor locked in a vehicle it is acceptable for the adult to break a
9 car window to rescue the child if they are left unattended and the outside temperature is seventy degrees
10 Fahrenheit or warmer.

12 Section 3: This bill requires no funding on behalf of the state of Kentucky.

14 Section 4: There are no consequences for individual that breaks the window if a child is left unattended in a
15 locked vehicle.

16
17 Section 5: This bill will be enforced by the law enforcement officers of the state of Kentucky.

18
19 Section 6: All laws or parts of laws in conflict with this bill are hereby repealed.

20
21 Section 7: This law will go into effect on January 1, 2016.
