3 4	Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky			
5 6 7	Section 1: This bill would require Kentucky's citizens to retake and renew their physical driving exam every eight years.			
8 9 10 11 12	Section 2: The enabling of this bill would ensure safety on Kentucky's roads by updating and evaluating the physical driving skills of lincensed drivers. This bill would prevent unseasoned and/or from being a potential hazard to the road by reevaluating everyone's driving ability in order to make roads as safe as possible for all types of drivers.			
13 14 15 16	Section 3: The logistics and budget of this bill would require no government funding or tax payer's money. This means that outside of personal money spent {by the driver} to update their physical driving test would not conflict with public money.			
17 18 19 20 21	Section 4: The following practices: I: Failure in retaking and/or passing a physical driver's test every eight years after a full permit is given. Ii: Driving without a mark of approval signifying the updated physical pass. Iii: Causing an accident while driving without a mark of approval signifying the updated physical pass.			
22 23 24 25	Will result in the following: lv: Confiscation of license and fine of at least one hundred dollars. V: Confiscation of license, traffic school/ driver's education courses, and a fine of at least one hundred fifty dollars.			
26 27	Vi: Confiscation of license, jailtime, and no allowed driving for six months after served time in jail.			
28 29	Section 5: this law would be enforced by the evaluators of drivers' physical driving exams and police officers.			
30 31	Section 6. All laws or parts of laws that conflict with this bill are hereby repealed.			
32	Section 7: This law will go into effect on january 1, 2016.
