- 1 An act to reinstate the right to vote to convicted felons who have successfully served their sentence.

- 3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
- 4
- 5 Section 1: Presently, the Commonwealth of Kentucky is one of only four states that denies the right to vote
- 6 to convicted felons after they have served their sentence.
- 7
- 8 Section 2: Having paid their debt to society for their crime, felons who have served their sentence should
- 9 once again have the right to vote.
- 10
- 11 Section 3: This will not require any funding to enact.
- 12
- 13 Section 4: This bill will take place immediately upon passage before the next election cycle.
