Every day in Kentucky, there are nearly 42 suicide attempts and two deaths. (http://www.sprc.org). These tragedies could be prevented if the warning signs were detected and given attention by a mental health professional as soon as warning signs appear.
10 11 12 13 14 15 16	Section 2: 3.3% of 13 to 18 year olds have experienced a serious, debilitating, depressive disorder. Eight percent of teens, aged 13–18 years old, have an anxiety disorder, with symptoms commonly emerging around 6 years old. However, of these teens, only 18% received mental health care. (http://www.sprc.org). All students should have a right to mental healthcare, as not receiving treatment could have a negative impact on their ability to perform in school, and thereby prevent them from receiving their education, a protected property according to the Constitution.
17 18 19	Section 3: When students with mental health problems go untreated, they pose a significant risk to themselves and others.
20 21	Section 4: This bill would be enforced by the Kentucky Cabinet for Health and Family Services.
22 23	Section 5: This will be funded by the local taxes for health, which also fund the local health departments.
24 25	Section 6: This bill shall come into effect August 1, 2016.
