An act to require all head of cattle entering a feedlot to be properly vaccinated and tested for diseases and viruses such as Black Leg, BVD, and Pneumonia.
Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky
Section 1: Proper documentation of vaccinations and testing must be provided to feedlot manager prior to delivery of cattle by owner.
Section 2: Record of Vaccinations including but not limited to: Black Leg and Pneumonia.
Section 3: No cattle will be allowed to enter a feedlot without proper documentation for testing of BVD, Bovine Viral Diarrhea, if a head of cattle tests positive for BVD it will not be allowed to enter the feedlot.
Section 4: All vaccines must be administered by trained personnel, with a record of certification.
Section 5: There will be a 30 day gestation period after the vaccine is administered until the feedlot manager is allowed to market the beef.
Section 6: All records must be made available to the Kentucky Department of Agriculture for inspection.
Section 7: Fines of the feedlot for not providing documentation:
1st Offense- Feedlot owner will be given 2 weeks to provide documentation and no un-vaccinated/tested cattle may be sold.
2nd Offense- Fine of 200 dollars per head of un-vaccinated/tested cattle. Owner will be given 2 weeks to provide documentation.
3rd Offense- All of the un-vaccinated/tested cattle must be returned to original owner.
Section 8: On January 1, 2015 all farmers will be encouraged to begin vaccinating and testing all cattle. Full implementation of this bill will take effect January 1, 2016 requiring records of vaccination and testing before entering a feedlot.
