1 An act to require all public schools to offer a study period for all students in grades 6-12.
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3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
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5 Section 1: This act would require all public middle schools and high schools to offer a study period or "study
6 hall" for all students grades six through twelve in the state of Kentucky.
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8 Section 2: School will offer an extra period in the schedule for a study period. During the study period
9 student would be able to study for tests, finish homework, research and receive help with material from
10 resource teachers in study hall.
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12 Section 3: No funding will be needed for the program, however a reallocation of resource teachers may be
13 necessary in some schools. The Kentucky State Board of Education would evaluate and enforce the act.
14 Schools found not to comply would face a first offense warning, second offense 2% cut in funding to the
15 year and a 10% cut if they fail to comply a third time. Schools will be offered help from the Board of
16 Education after the first warning.
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18 Section 4: This act will go into effect August 1, 2015.
