1 An act to allow "non-voting" student representation on SBDM councils.
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3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
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5 Section 1: Students currently lack a voice when it comes to Site Based Decision Making Councils (SBDM).
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7 Section 2: This bill would require public schools (with grades 5 and up) to actively seek student applicants to
8 be "non-voting" members of their SBDM councils. Schools may select 1 (minimum) or 2 (maximum) students.
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10 Section 3: Interested students would complete an application, including a writing prompt on why they want
11 to serve. Applications should include 1-2 teacher referrals. Criteria should include the following: A/B average,
12 no office referrals, proof of extracurricular activities.

14 Section 4: If no students apply, schools must show proof that they adequately advertised the position. This
15 must be done to comply with the law. If passed, this bill will take affect in the 2015-2016 school year.
