They are 28 times more likely to make an attempt on their own life (www.psychologytoday.com). 14% of the autistic youth have either attempted or discussed committing suicide compared to the 0.5% of non autistic youth (www.healthday.com). That means that a staggering 67 million Children worldwide are affected by autism (www.solancounty.com). These numbers continue to rise, in 2014, it is estimated by the Center for Disease Control that 1 in 68 children in the U.S. have been diagnosed with Autism (www.cdc.gov). And the numbers are expected to rise.
14 15 16 17	Section 2: Students with autism can have radical and violent outbursts if sensory processes issues are triggered In most schools, teachers and students have little to no knowledge about autism. When a teacher issues disciplinary consequences, it may create an angry lashing out, making the student a social outcast.
18 19 20	Section 3: This bill will require training for teachers and to help them understand the best way to diffuse an autistic student when he or she is unable to cope with the demands of an educational environment.
20 21 22 23	Section 4: This bill will be enforced by the Kentucky Department of Education, and will be at least six hours of the teachers' required professional development that they are required to get each year.
