1 An act to allow private and home schooled students to participate in interscholastic activities.
2
3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
4
5 Section 1: The purpose of this bill is to allow private and home schooled students the opportunity to
6 participate in extracurricular activities that their school doesn't provide. These activities include
7 sports, music programs, clubs, etc.
8
9 Section 2: The private and home schooled students will beheld at the same standards as public school
10 students, including grade requirements and sports fees. They will have to tryout or audition just as
11 public school students do.
12
13 Section 3: Home school and private school families are already paying taxes to fund the public schools
14 and other school programs. Therefore, they should be eligible to participate in the extracurricular
15 activities that their school does not provide.
16
17 Section 4: Some states already have similar laws implemented. Such as, the Tim Tebow Law in Florida.
18 More than twenty states have already passed this bill.
19
20 Section 5: This bill will go into effect on July 1, 2018.
