1 An act to restore civil rights to any person convicted Class C and D felon, who have served under nine
2 years in prison.

4 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
5

6 Section 1: Anyone who served under nine years in state prison are classified as C and/or D felons.
7 Which is a non-violent conviction.
8

9 Section 2: The rights we want to restore are basic rights such as voting, traveling, jury duty, and public
10 social benefits, including housing.
11

12 Section 3: Kentucky is on of five states that requires restoration by a Governor. Last year, the
13 Governor was only able to restore 201 felons our of 3,400 rights.

15 Section 4: This bill will cost nothing. The bill is to revise House Bill 70 in 2016. This will allow non-
16 violent offenders to return to the work force without discrimination.
