3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

5 Section I: To create smoke-free public facilities the cost will be no higher than \$10,000. The only need
6 for money may be to create designated smoking areas.

8 Section II: This bill could go into effect almost immediately. A specific date could be sometime in
9 January of 2017.

11 Section III: To protect people from the harmful dangers of secondhand smoke, this bill needs to be
12 passed.

15 population, around twenty-four million, has asthma.
