2 3 4	Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky
4 5 6 7	Section 1: This bill will require all public collages and universities to put into place security measures to aid in the protection of students and faculty.
8 9 10 11 12 13 14	Section 2: Our bill will implement a campus force which will provide such services as assisting with vehicle lockouts, providing security escorts to anyone on campus, and conducting car and foot patrols around campus. Campuses will require use of ID cards when wanting access to campus activities and services. Students working in classrooms after hours must have a faculty member present. A text messaging hot-line will be put in place to alert staff and students of disturbances around the campus. Finally, a strict no alcohol or drug policy will be enforced.
15 16 17 18 19	Section 3: The campus force would be a combination of volunteer students and hired officers. Before being put onto campus force students must go through a rigorous check by the school. A small increase in tuition cost as well as a small increase in funding from the state will allow schools to pay for officers as well as any other changes that will be made.
20 21 22	Section 4: Schools that do not comply to the safety standards will receive a warning that state funding will be withdrawn. If they fail to put the safety measures in place after a 2 month period state funding will be retracted until they are implemented.

- 22 23 24 Section 5: This bill will be put into action by the beginning of the new semester in the year 2018.
