An act to require a safety day in schools throughout Kentucky.

Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

Section 1: Tragedies happen every day, whether we are where them or not. This bill would help students and teachers be prepared for catastrophes can hospitality or injuries and schools.

Section 2: Elementary, middle, and high schools would be required to offer training for natural disaster preparedness and emergency situations. All students would be required to participate in these trainings, which would be conducted during school day. Students will learn what to do during the fire, tornado, earthquake, lockdown, bomb threat, and a medical emergency, as well as why they would take these actions and secondary plans of action. Teachers will learn how to control students and keep all individuals involved safe.

Section 3: High schools will be required to have an active shooter training, in which all faculty is required to participate. Student participation will be optional based parental permission. This training will be after school and transportation will be available for student to stay to participate.

Section 4: The natural disaster training will be required to take place during the first 10 days of the school year and each year thereafter. The active shooter training maybe conducted biannually and must take place during the first semester of the school year.

Section 5: This bill will go into effect for the 2017 – 2018 school year.
