An act to add a provision to current legislation requiring drivers 70 and older to take a driver's test in addition to a vision screening.

Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

Section 1: In Kentucky, current legislation mandates that when a citizen reaches the age of 70 and upon the next renewal following that milestone, they must take a vision test when renewing their license. This bill proposes an additional provision to this legislation that would require senior drivers to additionally retake the driver's test. Drivers would not immediately re-test and renew when turning 70 but rather wait until the next scheduled renewal date as listed on their license.

Section 2: This bill will not eliminate age-related injuries and deaths caused by senior citizen drivers; however, it will seek to decrease those numbers and help equip elderly drivers with up-to-date training and information regarding safe driving.

Section 3: Adding this provision will affect drivers who turn 70 beginning January 1, 2018 and will not affect drivers over age 70 who have previously had their licenses revoked.

Section 4: Senior citizen drivers across the state of Kentucky will be affected by this bill. Drivers will continue to take their vision test and driver's test in their county of residence at the appropriate testing site.

Section 5: This bill will go into effect on January 1, 2018.
