1 An act to establish an unrestricted line-item veto power for the Governor of Kentucky.

3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

5 Section 1: Section 88 of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Kentucky gives the Governor limited  
6 line-item veto power on appropriation bills.

8 Section 2: This bill will grant the Governor line-item veto rights on all legislation that is submitted to  
9 the Executive Office for signature.

11 Section 3: Currently, there is no limitation on the "rider" and/or "pork belly" legislation that can be  
12 added to any bill. Senators and Congressman of the Commonwealth of Kentucky have misused the  
13 limitation of the line-item veto to add superfluous legislation to bills other than appropriation bills.

15 Section 4: This bill will effectively stop the "rider" and "pork belly" legislative practices, which would  
16 save the Commonwealth millions of dollars in misappropriated funds.

17

18 Section 5: This line-item veto is subject to the same veto override provisions as any full veto currently  
19 and subsequently provided by the laws and Constitution of the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

20

21 Section 6: This bill will take effect July 1, 2017.
