1 An act to end "patchwork prohibition" in the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

5 Section 1: This bill will provide that the manufacturing, sale, distribution and transportation of
6 intoxicating liquors is lawful within the entire geographic area of each and every county in the
7 Commonwealth of Kentucky.

9 Section 2: This bill addresses the desire to see that all counties within the Commonwealth of Kentucky
10 have the same opportunity to benefit from the substantial economic and social benefits derived from
11 the sale of alcohol.

13 Section 3: Once approved would make alcohol regulations the same for all 120 counties in Kentucky.

15 Section 4: Alcohol sales would be regulated by the Kentucky Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control,
16 the state agency that currently oversees the permit application process that businesses must go
17 through in order to sell or manufacture alcohol in the Commonwealth.

19 Section 5: Allowing alcohol sales in previously dry counties would result in new jobs and additional
20 revenue for those cities and counties. This new source of revenue would be used to strengthen county
21 infrastructures, fund education, provide public assistance, health care and maintain our correctional
22 facilities.

23
24 Section 6: This bill will go into effect on January 1, 2017.
