An act to regulate and license the use of medical 3D printers in hospitals

## Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

Section 1: This bill will require the Kentucky Board of Medical Licensure to add 3D printing to the list of practices they regulate. Hospitals that have and use medical 3D printers will have to obtain a license that must be renewed yearly. This license will ensure that the doctors and hospital staff know how to correctly use and maintain the devices.

Section 2: Any doctors or technicians who operate or maintain the medical 3D printers must have taken a course or be certified in operating and maintaining 3D printers. The course or certification must come from an accredited place of higher education.

Section 3: Any hospital that utilizes a medical 3D printer for any medical purpose (i.e. printing medicine, tools, and organs) must have a license to operate it. The license will be issued by the KBML, and the 3D printing space must be inspected by a member from the KBML on an annual basis, which will constitute the renewal of the license.

Section 4: Offenses will comply with KBML protocol and are as follows:

- First offense: For the first offense (i.e. a 3D printer is not licensed or an operator is not certified), the hospital will be fined \$15,000.
- Subsequent offenses: For any subsequent offenses that occur, the case will be subject to review and penalties will be levied by the KBML.

Section Five: This bill will go into effect on January 1, 2017.
