Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

Section 1: This bill will abolish tenure for teachers in schools K-12.

Section 2: This bill will apply to all schools K-12 in the state of Kentucky.

Section 3: Teacher tenure can be defined as the policy that restricts the ability to fire teachers. requiring a "just cause" rationale for firing.

Section 4: This bill will not have an additional cost.

Section 5: This bill will be enforced by the Kentucky Department of Education (KDE).

Section 6: Failure to abide by this law will result in the following penalties:

- 1st offense: A warning to the school district from the KDE.
- 2nd offense: \$200 fine on the school district from the KDE.
- 3rd offense: \$500 fine on the school district from the KDE.
- 4th offense: \$1000 fine every month until the school district in compliance with the law.
- 5th offense: Failure to comply after one full school year following their fourth offense, the superintendent of the school district will be fired and the fine of \$1000 will continue until the school district is in compliance with the law.

Section 7: All laws or parts of laws in conflict with this bill are hereby repealed.

Section 8: This bill will go into effect a year later after its passing with the signature of the Governor.
