

GLOBAL COMPETENCY STANDARDS AND THE KENTUCKY UNITED NATIONS ASSEMBLY

The Kentucky United Nations Assembly (KUNA) is a three-day experiential learning conference in which students participate directly in simulated international diplomacy. KUNA offers middle and high school students the opportunity to experience the richness of cultures from around the world, develop empathy, and hone their critical thinking skills while engaging with a wide variety of global issues and perspectives.
