The goal in this class is to explore and better understand Kentucky and its government processes. This course will begin with an overview of Kentucky history and culture then move to current events in the state. While exploring relevant issues in Kentucky, students will be asked to think critically about their research process and the sources they procure.

The course is woven in with the Kentucky Youth Assembly calendar and will provide students ample opportunity to develop bill ideas and prepare for the conference. A quide to Service-Based Learning will be a part of the course design, although completely optional depending upon resources and time. Students will be able to research, design, and then implement a service project, culminating in a presentation on an issue that is important to the student.
