The Homeplace 1850s Farm will feature "Quilts, Coverlets and Comforters: Keeping Warm in the 1850s" on Saturday and Sunday, Sept. 16 and 17, 10 a.m.-3p.m., at Land Between the Lakes National Recreation Area. Programs included with general admission; ages 13 and up \$5, ages 5-12 \$3, and ages 4 and under free.

"We invite everyone to learn how warm bed coverings were made," says Homeplace Lead Interpreter Cindy Earls. "Stop and join the quilting bee as we try to finish the Pinwheel patchwork quilt before the weather gets too cold to work outside. Children can lend a hand tying a comforter and watch the weaver make a coverlet on the barn loom from our sheep's wool."

Discover the rich textile traditions of an 1850 farm and explore the bed coverings that kept a family warm at night. From quilting bees, weaving looms and knitting needles, farm women made a wide variety of bed coverings with homegrown fibers.

Kentucky YMCA's Y-Corps team participates in community service

Recently, a group of Kentucky teens with the Kentucky YMCA's Y-Corps team got a dose of local history and engaged in an impactful service project in the Between the Rivers region.

The Y-Corps team had 28 students from every part of Kentucky along with adult staff and volunteers. They were on a weeklong service trip to learn about their commonwealth and serve their fellow citizens. On July 28 their trip brought them to Woodson Chapel Cemetery, one of hundreds of

small cemeteries left behind when the federal government invoked eminent domain and mandated the evacuation of the land ahead of the creation of the Land Between the Lakes National Recreation Area.

Working with members of Between the Rivers, Inc. (BTR), a local preservation group, the students helped clear a fallen cedar tree.

Large sawn sections of the tree were moved to a pavilion to be used as seating for an outdoor meeting space.

The rest of the tree was removed from the cemetery.

Upon completion of the project the students learned some of the history of the area and its displaced communities from BTR President David Nickell and other members of the group. To round out their day the students did a walking tour of historic downtown Cadiz before sharing a meal at Reva's Place.
