23 24 following penalties will be applied to the accused: 1st Offense: Customer is reimbursed within 30 days after the accusation is found to be true and a warning is issued. 2nd Offense: Customer is reimbursed within 30 days after the accusation is found to be true and a fine of \$500 is issued. 3rd Offense: Customer is reimbursed within 30 days after the accusation is found to be true and a lawsuit will be filed, allowing the judiciary system to issue further consequences.

Section 5: If the customer is not reimbursed within the allotted 30 days, the accused will be fined \$200 every week that the reimbursement has not been issued.

Section 6: Once passed, this bill will go into effect January 1, 2019.
