## DAY TWO

### IN FRANKFORT

**At the Capitol:** Whether your delegation departs for the Capitol first thing in the morning or as part of the second group, the timing of bus-loading, transport, and unloading is crucial. Each “tag” will stop at Claudia Sanders restaurant outside Frankfort for a delicious lunch either on their way to Frankfort or on their return trip. Advisors are asked to ensure that delegations are moving safely and efficiently to and from their busses during these travel transitions. Drop off at the Capitol will be at the bottom of the steps at the plaza in front of the Capitol. The walk up the steps to the Capitol entrance is also your allotted opportunity for a quick delegation photo, but please keep in mind that debate will start promptly without regard to absent delegations.

**Commonwealth to the Capitol, Bluegrass to the Annex:** At the front entrance to the Capitol each delegation will divide into their respective program levels. Commonwealth delegates will enter the Capitol and proceed immediately to either the House or Senate Chambers to commence debate. Bluegrass delegates will be directed around the side of the Capitol Building, where Y-Staff and volunteers will guide them to their “House” and “Senate” debate rooms in the Capitol Annex Building. All delegates will remain and debate in their assigned chambers for the duration of their time in Frankfort.

**Bill-Sponsors and Bill Flow:** Bill Sponsors will present their bills as assigned in the docket announcements from the previous evening. Students serving as House Speaker, Senate President, and in other leadership roles are in charge of running the debate chambers, ensuring fair and proper parliamentary procedure, and directing the flow of bills between chambers. If a bill passes in one chamber, the sponsors will be directed to the second chamber where their bill will be added to that docket. Bluegrass sponsors of bills passing two chambers will meet with the Lt. Governor; Commonwealth sponsors of bills passing two chambers will meet with the Governor. At high school conferences, Commonwealth bills passed in two chambers will go to the Governor, who may either sign the bills into law or veto them. Any sponsor who does not meet with the Governor or Lt. Governor before chambers close for the day will have an opportunity to do so at the end of the day by signing up for a meeting time at the Y-Desk.

**Dismissal from the Capitol:** After debate has concluded, Bluegrass delegates will be dismissed from the Annex Building to walk directly to the bus loading area back at the bottom of the front plaza steps. All Commonwealth delegates will gather briefly in the House of Representatives in the Capitol before being dismissed to busses. Prompt loading and departure of busses is crucial to keeping lunch and travel rotations on schedule; advisors and delegations are asked to refrain from stopping for photographs during dismissal time.
