1 **An Act Relating To The Change Of Eligibility For Medicaid To A Monthly Basis**
2 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
3
4 Section 1: The Kentucky Cabinet for Health and Family Services’ Department for Medicaid Services shall
5 update existing regulations to review Medicaid eligibility annually for individuals currently enrolled in the
6 program.
7
8 Section 2: For individuals who may become eligible for Medicaid services due to a change in income and
9 circumstance outside the open enrollment period, the Department shall establish a process through which
10 individuals can apply for Medicaid benefits on a month-to-month basis.
11
12 Section 3: The Department shall establish a process that includes prior year tax forms or other income
13 verification processes that ensures accessibility, equity, and efficiency.
14
15 Section 4: This bill will be implemented by the Kentucky Department of Medicare in collaboration with the
16 Department of Revenue as they develop and implement the necessary systems and processes to facilitate
17 the monthly assessment of eligibility based off need. All individuals and entities subject to the qualifications
18 criteria shall be required to submit the necessary financial data and information on a monthly basis, as
19 specified by the Kentucky Department of Medicare services
20
21 Section 5: This law shall be in effect as long as Kentucky continues to participate in the federal Medicaid
22 expansion under the Affordable Care Act.
23
24 Section 6: This bill will go into effect on January 1st, 2025.

1 An Act Relating To the prevention of minors' usage of shock sites
2 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
3
4 Section 1: It is proposed that of KRS chapter 436.001 the Constitution of Kentucky be created to read as
5 follows: Insert subsection 8 'harmful to minors' (d) : 1 .Beheadings, execution, electrocution, suicide, murder,
6 stoning, torching and hanging 2. Police brutality, cartel violence and terrorism/active hate groups 3.
7 Drowning, vehicular accident or any accidental deaths 4. War victims, prisoners of war
8
9 Section 2: Penalties follows KRS 436.002 (1) Any covered platform that knowingly and intentionally
10 publishes or distributes material on the internet, more than one-third (1/3) of which is matter harmful to
11 minors, and fails to perform age verification, either by itself or through a third party, of individuals
12 attempting to access the matter shall be liable as provided in this section. (2) Any person injured by a
13 violation of this section, or a parent or legal guardian on behalf of any minor injured by a violation of this
14 section, may bring a civil action against the covered platform to recover: (a) Damages of ten thousand dollars
15 (\$10,000) per instance that the covered platform failed to perform age verification to restrict the minor's
16 access to matter harmful to minors; and (b) Actual damages, court costs, and reasonable attorney's fees. (3)
17 This section shall only apply to a minor who: (a) Is a permanent resident of this state; (b) Has resided in this
18 state for more than one (1) year; or (c) Has been sojourning in this state for a period of at least thirty-one
19 (31) consecutive days.

1 **An Act Relating To Granting Customers of High Value Goods The Right to Repair**
2 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
3
4 Section 1: A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 365 IS CREATED TO READ AS FOLLOWS: (1) Consumers of
5 high-value goods, defined as electronics, appliances, phones, and farm equipment with a wholesale value
6 exceeding \$100, shall have the right to repair such items. (2) Manufacturers of high-value goods shall make
7 available to product owners, service and repair facilities, and service dealers: (a) Documentation, including
8 diagnostic and repair manuals, (b) Functional replacement parts, (c) Required tools and software updates, on
9 fair and reasonable terms. (3) Manufacturers must ensure these resources are available for a minimum of
10 eight years following the last date of manufacture of a product model, irrespective of product warranty
11 period.
12
13 Section 2: Manufacturer Protections: (1) Manufacturers are required to comply with the provisions of this
14 Act but are not obligated to disclose: (a) Proprietary trade secrets, copyrights, or patents beyond what is
15 necessary to enable repair. (b) Information that would allow an individual to bypass, override, or disable
16 safety or anti-theft features embedded within high-value goods. (2) Manufacturers shall not be held liable
17 for any damages, injuries, or warranty-voiding that result from repairs conducted by the owner or
18 independent repair provider using parts, tools, or information provided under this Act.
19
20 Section 3: (1) A Kentucky Right to Repair Board shall be an independent regulatory body responsible for
21 overseeing and enforcing the requirements set forth in this Act. (2) The Board shall consist of 5 members,
22 each serving a term of 4 years. Members shall be appointed by the presiding Governor of the Commonwealth
23 of Kentucky and confirmed by the Kentucky State Senate. (3) Members of the Board shall have expertise in
24 relevant areas, including electronics, consumer rights, product engineering, and commercial regulation. (4)
25 The Board shall have the authority to investigate claims of non-compliance by manufacturers and impose
26 penalties or fines as determined appropriate by the provisions of this Act. (5) The Board shall establish and
27 maintain a public portal for consumers and independent repair providers to submit complaints or concerns
28 regarding manufacturers' compliance. (6) The Board shall report annually to the Kentucky General Assembly
29 on the Act's impact, including compliance rates, complaint summaries, and any recommendations for
30 legislative updates.

1 An Act Relating To Mandatory Leave for Victims of Sexual Assault, Domestic Violence, and Stalking
2 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
3

4 Section 1: A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 336 IS CREATED TO READ AS FOLLOWS: Any employee who is
5 a victim of sexual violence, domestic violence, or stalking may take both paid and unpaid leave to seek the
6 following: (1) Law enforcement assistance or protection. (2) Medical aid, including, but not limited to physical
7 and mental health therapies. (3) Related services from a victim shelter or crisis center of the victim’s
8 choosing. (4) New housing arrangements for safety purposes.
9

10 Section 2: (1) To take leave under this Act, an employee is required to present one or more of the following
11 documentation: (a) An official police report or protective order. (b) An official written statement of
12 confirmation or permission for leave of absence from an attorney, a law enforcement officer, a health care
13 professional, a licensed mental health practitioner or counselor, a member of the clergy, or a certified victim
14 services provider. (2) Employers reserve the right to waive such a requirement if deemed unnecessary for the
15 admission of paid and unpaid leave.
16


17 Section 3: Employees must provide employers with at least a 24 hours’ notice of their leave when possible,
18 unless extenuating circumstances prevent timely notification.
19

20 Section 4: (1) All documentation and information provided to employers regarding leave for reasons of sexual
21 violence, domestic violence, or stalking must remain strictly confidential. (2) Confidential information may
22 only be disclosed with consent from the employee in question or when otherwise mandated by law.
23


24 Section 5: Per 12-month period (1) Companies employing 25 or more employees are required to provide: (a)
25 A minimum of 7 days of paid leave. (b) A minimum of 30 days of unpaid leave. (2) Companies employing
26 fewer than 25 employees are required to provide: (a) A minimum of three days of paid leave. (b) A minimum
27 of 14 days of unpaid leave.
28

29 Section 6: (1) Employees who take leave under this Act are protected from any form of workplace
30 discrimination or retaliation from their employer. (2) Prohibited actions include but are not limited to
31 termination, promotion refusal, demotion, harassment, or other unfair treatment related to the employee’s
32 use of leave under this Act.
33

34 Section 7: Any statute contrary to this Act is to be amended or repealed.

An Act Relating To Feminine Hygiene Products in Public Schools

Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky


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Section 1: A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 158 IS CREATED TO READ AS FOLLOWS: All public schools in Kentucky will be required to supply feminine hygiene products within women’s and gender-neutral restrooms.


Section 2: Within Kentucky, it is not required for schools to supply their students with feminine hygiene products. This new section of KRS Chapter 158 will require all public schools in Kentucky to supply these products within restrooms.

Section 3: Any statute contrary to this Act shall be amended or repealed.

Section 4: This act takes effect January 1, 2025.

- 9 Section 2: Standards will come from the health curriculum the school chooses but must include CPR
- 10 certification, Heimlich maneuver, and having knowledge of signs of stroke and heart attack.

- 12 Section 3: Funding will come from the Kentucky Department of Education if needed.

- 14 Section 4: The Kentucky Department of Education would enforce this law to make sure that all students

2 or a crime resulting in death.


3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

4
5 SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 500 and CHAPTER 16 IS CREATED TO READ AS FOLLOWS:

6 (1) Except as provided in KRS 500.090, KRS 500.092, and KRS 16.220, all property which is subject to
7 forfeiture under any section of the Kentucky Penal Code shall be disposed of in accordance with this section.

8 (2) The Department of Kentucky State Police shall receive firearms, ammunition, and other non-specified
9 items confiscated by or abandoned to every law enforcement agency in Kentucky used in the commitment of
10 a crime that resulted in death of human life, including but not limited to crimes such as murder and
11 involuntary homicide. (3) The Department of Kentucky State Police shall dispose of the firearms, ammunition,
12 and other non-specified items received in the manner specified in KRS 500.090, KRS 500.092, and KRS
13 16.220. However, firearms used in the commitment of a crime that resulted in death of human life, including
14 but not limited to crimes such as murder, involuntary homicide, and/or manslaughter, which are not retained
15 for official use, returned to an innocent lawful owner, or transferred to another government agency or public
16 museum shall be destroyed. (4) Any weapon, including but not limited to firearms, used in the commitment of
17 a crime that resulted in the death of human life shall not be sold at public auction.

19 SECTION 2. Any statute contrary to this Act shall be amended or repealed.

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An Act relating to increasing KEES money rates in Kentucky
Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky


Section 1: This bill is intended for the betterment and affordability of college tuition for Kentuckians. It is also intended to provide scholarships to academically accomplished students.

Section 2: This bill would see that KEES or Kentucky Educational Excellence Scholarship rates would increase with tuition rates of Kentucky Colleges.


Section 3: This would result in a 1 to 5 ratio between KEES and college tuition. For every five percent college tuition rates raise, KEES money rate would raise by one percent. This bill would be enforced by the Kentucky Department of Education

Section 4: The funding for this bill would be provided by the Kentucky Department of Education, as well as the Kentucky Lottery’s revenue fund. This bill would be implemented in every highschool and college in Kentucky

Section 5: If enacted, this bill would go into effect on August 1, 2025.

9 down by the local police; This bill will be enacted by October 2026, and the owners of mountaintop removal
10 operations will be sent a notice to shut down operations

- 6 same resources that rightful convicts who served their time received upon their release. (2) Exonerated
- 7 persons will receive the appropriate transitional resources according to the amount of time they spent in
- 8 prison, as decided by the Court of Appeals.
