An Act Relating To The Change Of Eligibility For Medicaid To A Monthly Basis Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

Section 1: The Kentucky Cabinet for Health and Family Services' Department for Medicaid Services shall update existing regulations to review Medicaid eligibility annually for individuals currently enrolled in the program.

Section 2: For individuals who may become eligible for Medicaid services due to a change in income and circumstance outside the open enrollment period, the Department shall establish a process through which individuals can apply for Medicaid benefits on a month-to-month basis.

Section 3: The Department shall establish a process that includes prior year tax forms or other income verification processes that ensures accessibility, equity, and efficiency.

Section 4: This bill will be implemented by the Kentucky Department of Medicare in collaboration with the Department of Revenue as they develop and implement the necessary systems and processes to facilitate the monthly assessment of eligibility based off need. All individuals and entities subject to the qualifications criteria shall be required to submit the necessary financial data and information on a monthly basis, as specified by the Kentucky Department of Medicare services

Section 5: This law shall be in effect as long as Kentucky continues to participate in the federal Medicaid expansion under the Affordable Care Act.

Section 6: This bill will go into effect on January 1st, 2025.

An Act Relating To the prevention of minors' usage of shock sites Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

Section 1: It is proposed that of KRS chapter 436.001 the Constitution of Kentucky be created to read as follows: Insert subsection 8 'harmful to minors' (d): 1 .Beheadings, execution, electrocution, suicide, murder, stoning, torching and hanging 2. Police brutality, cartel violence and terrorism/active hate groups 3. Drowning, vehicular accident or any accidental deaths 4. War victims, prisoners of war

Section 2: Penalties follows KRS 436.002 (1) Any covered platform that knowingly and intentionally publishes or distributes material on the internet, more than one-third (1/3) of which is matter harmful to minors, and fails to perform age verification, either by itself or through a third party, of individuals attempting to access the matter shall be liable as provided in this section. (2) Any person injured by a violation of this section, or a parent or legal guardian on behalf of any minor injured by a violation of this section, may bring a civil action against the covered platform to recover: (a) Damages of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) per instance that the covered platform failed to perform age verification to restrict the minor's access to matter harmful to minors; and (b) Actual damages, court costs, and reasonable attorney's fees. (3) This section shall only apply to a minor who: (a) Is a permanent resident of this state; (b) Has resided in this state for more than one (1) year; or (c) Has been sojourning in this state for a period of at least thirty-one (31) consecutive days.

An Act Relating To Granting Customers of High Value Goods The Right to Repair Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

Section 1: A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 365 IS CREATED TO READ AS FOLLOWS: (1) Consumers of high-value goods, defined as electronics, appliances, phones, and farm equipment with a wholesale value exceeding \$100, shall have the right to repair such items. (2) Manufacturers of high-value goods shall make available to product owners, service and repair facilities, and service dealers: (a) Documentation, including diagnostic and repair manuals, (b) Functional replacement parts, (c) Required tools and software updates, on fair and reasonable terms. (3) Manufacturers must ensure these resources are available for a minimum of eight years following the last date of manufacture of a product model, irrespective of product warranty period.

Section 2: Manufacturer Protections: (1) Manufacturers are required to comply with the provisions of this Act but are not obligated to disclose: (a) Proprietary trade secrets, copyrights, or patents beyond what is necessary to enable repair. (b) Information that would allow an individual to bypass, override, or disable safety or anti-theft features embedded within high-value goods. (2) Manufacturers shall not be held liable for any damages, injuries, or warranty-voiding that result from repairs conducted by the owner or independent repair provider using parts, tools, or information provided under this Act.

Section 3: (1) A Kentucky Right to Repair Board shall be an independent regulatory body responsible for overseeing and enforcing the requirements set forth in this Act. (2) The Board shall consist of 5 members, each serving a term of 4 years. Members shall be appointed by the presiding Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and confirmed by the Kentucky State Senate. (3) Members of the Board shall have expertise in relevant areas, including electronics, consumer rights, product engineering, and commercial regulation. (4) The Board shall have the authority to investigate claims of non-compliance by manufacturers and impose penalties or fines as determined appropriate by the provisions of this Act. (5) The Board shall establish and maintain a public portal for consumers and independent repair providers to submit complaints or concerns regarding manufacturers' compliance. (6) The Board shall report annually to the Kentucky General Assembly on the Act's impact, including compliance rates, complaint summaries, and any recommendations for legislative updates.

An Act Relating To Mandatory Leave for Victims of Sexual Assault, Domestic Violence, and Stalking

Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

 Section 1: A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 336 IS CREATED TO READ AS FOLLOWS: Any employee who is a victim of sexual violence, domestic violence, or stalking may take both paid and unpaid leave to seek the following: (1) Law enforcement assistance or protection. (2) Medical aid, including, but not limited to physical and mental health therapies. (3) Related services from a victim shelter or crisis center of the victim's choosing. (4) New housing arrangements for safety purposes.

Section 2: (1) To take leave under this Act, an employee is required to present one or more of the following documentation: (a) An official police report or protective order. (b) An official written statement of confirmation or permission for leave of absence from an attorney, a law enforcement officer, a health care professional, a licensed mental health practitioner or counselor, a member of the clergy, or a certified victim services provider. (2) Employers reserve the right to waive such a requirement if deemed unnecessary for the admission of paid and unpaid leave.

Section 3: Employees must provide employers with at least a 24 hours' notice of their leave when possible, unless extenuating circumstances prevent timely notification.

Section 4: (1) All documentation and information provided to employers regarding leave for reasons of sexual violence, domestic violence, or stalking must remain strictly confidential. (2) Confidential information may only be disclosed with consent from the employee in question or when otherwise mandated by law.

Section 5: Per 12-month period (1) Companies employing 25 or more employees are required to provide: (a) A minimum of 7 days of paid leave. (b) A minimum of 30 days of unpaid leave. (2) Companies employing fewer than 25 employees are required to provide: (a) A minimum of three days of paid leave. (b) A minimum of 14 days of unpaid leave.

Section 6: (1) Employees who take leave under this Act are protected from any form of workplace discrimination or retaliation from their employer. (2) Prohibited actions include but are not limited to termination, promotion refusal, demotion, harassment, or other unfair treatment related to the employee's use of leave under this Act.

Section 1: AMEND SECTION (1.b.2.) OF THE KRS STATUTE TITLED 158.6451 TO READ AS FOLLOWS: 2. Apply core concepts and principles from mathematics, the sciences, the arts, the humanities, social studies, core healthcare standards in case of emergency and practical living studies to situations they will encounter throughout their lives:

Section 2: Standards will come from the health curriculum the school chooses but must include CPR certification, Heimlich maneuver, and having knowledge of signs of stroke and heart attack.

Section 3: Funding will come from the Kentucky Department of Education if needed.

Section 4: The Kentucky Department of Education would enforce this law to make sure that all students would be receiving an education based around these guidelines. The curriculum would need to be adopted for the 2025–2026 academic year.

SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 500 and CHAPTER 16 IS CREATED TO READ AS FOLLOWS: (1) Except as provided in KRS 500.090, KRS 500.092, and KRS 16.220, all property which is subject to forfeiture under any section of the Kentucky Penal Code shall be disposed of in accordance with this section. (2) The Department of Kentucky State Police shall receive firearms, ammunition, and other non-specified items confiscated by or abandoned to every law enforcement agency in Kentucky used in the commitment of a crime that resulted in death of human life, including but not limited to crimes such as murder and involuntary homicide. (3) The Department of Kentucky State Police shall dispose of the firearms, ammunition, and other non-specified items received in the manner specified in KRS 500.090, KRS 500.092, and KRS 16.220. However, firearms used in the commitment of a crime that resulted in death of human life, including but not limited to crimes such as murder, involuntary homicide, and/or manslaughter, which are not retained for official use, returned to an innocent lawful owner, or transferred to another government agency or public museum shall be destroyed. (4) Any weapon, including but not limited to firearms, used in the commitment of a crime that resulted in the death of human life shall not be sold at public auction.
